Draw the woodland. Would there have been a river? What animals would have been around then?</p>

Open the link https://www.literacyshed.com/nightzoo.html</p> <p>Watch the third video under the heading 'A problem to address' and the fourth video under the heading 'Solving the problem'.</p> <p>Come up with a problem and how to solve it.</p> <p>If you can't access the link, decide on a problem you might have in a zoo and how you could solve it.</p>	<p>Look around your house and look for objects that are these 3D shapes: cube, cuboid, sphere, cylinder, cone. Draw them or take pictures.</p> <p>Extension: make something from different 3D shapes around the house, e.g. use cereal boxes to make a house. Take a picture.</p> <p>Challenge: Try and find something that is a triangular prism, a square based pyramid or a hexagonal prism.</p>	<p>Sketch the view from your bedroom window. Think back to when we sketched trees. Remember to look carefully at the detail and draw what you see, not what you think is there.</p>
