

Important Features of a Mosque



Shoe rack

A place to leave your shoes before entering.



Prayer mats

Mosques either have carpet with individual prayer mats or Muslims take their own prayer mat to worship upon.



Washroom

Muslims must wash before entering the main hall.



Qur'an

The Muslim holy book which is the word of God. It is treated with great respect and placed on a special wooden stand to be read

Important Features of a Mosque



Tasbih Beads

Beads hanging around the mosque for worshippers to help think about



Minaret

Most mosques have at least one minaret which is a tall thin tower. A man stands at the top and calls Muslims to prayer.

Mihrab

An alcove in the wall shows the direction the worshippers need to face.

This is the direction of Mecca in Saudi Arabia, the most sacred Muslim place in the world.
