Complete the table, answering the questions about the poem. <u>Remember to write in full sentences and check your punctuation.</u>	Mental addition and subtraction. Try to work out each question in your head. Each group has a different time limit to aim for. Get someone to check your answers when you have finished and for any you didn't get right, use a written method to work out. Answers sheet for parents on BVS website	Make a PE activity that your whole family can take part in.
