If you want to make it harder, try 4 digits by 3 digits. Create at least 10 multiplication questions and answer them.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you create a word problem using the numbers selected and the multiplication operation?</p>	<p>Art Project – collage.</p> <p>Your challenge is to make a collage using materials that you can find at home.
