The children who have been attending Music lessons with Rocksteady gave the whole school a performance to showcase their talent. They were amazing and certainly some future rock stars in the making! Well done!

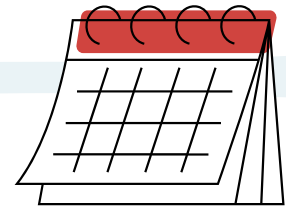
