

Improving the Quality of Education

Year 3

This term, the children took part in a fascinating workshop run by the National Archives Museum. They learnt all about what makes something a 'treasure' and had the opportunity to rate the importance of different historical artefacts. One pupil said, "I really enjoyed seeing what the treasure was and learning how important the National Archives is for keeping them safe!" It was a brilliant way to bring history to life and encourage thoughtful discussion.

VE day:

As part of our VE Day celebrations, we welcomed parents and other adults into school to take part in some special activities with the children. Together, they created medals to honour the soldiers who served during the war and wrote thoughtful diary entries to reflect on the end of the war and the joy of VE Day. It was a wonderful opportunity to come together as a community, learn more about this important historical event, and celebrate the bravery and resilience of those who lived through it.

Design & Technology:

We explored healthy eating by designing nutritious sandwiches. The children looked at what makes a balanced meal and examined the ingredients in different types of bread. They had fun creating their own healthy sandwich ideas and learned how to make informed food choices.

Science

In Science, we took our learning outdoors with a creative activity focused on the human skeleton. Using natural materials such as sticks, leaves, and stones, the children worked in teams to build their own life-sized skeletons. This hands-on experience helped deepen their understanding of how the human body is structured, while also making the most of the outdoor environment.

In English we have been reading different versions of the popular fairy tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. In one of our English lessons we held a classroom court case to decide if the wolf was guilty of harming the Three Little Pigs.

Tulips and Snapdragons created some beautiful pieces of artwork inspired by photographs of 'Japanese Cherry Blossom'. They used a variety of mediums including pastels, collage, watercolours and crayons. Their work has been displayed on the walls in the shared area and looks amazing!

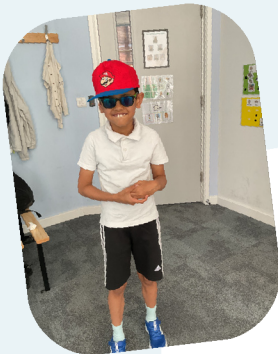


Year 6

Westbury MK OPEN Young Artist

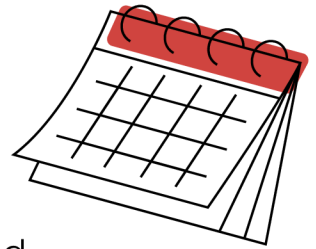
Westbury MK OPEN Young Artist.

We offer cereal, toast, fruit and juices getting you ready for the school day.

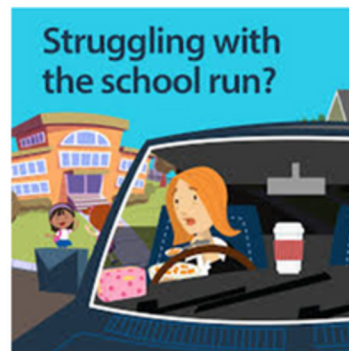
