

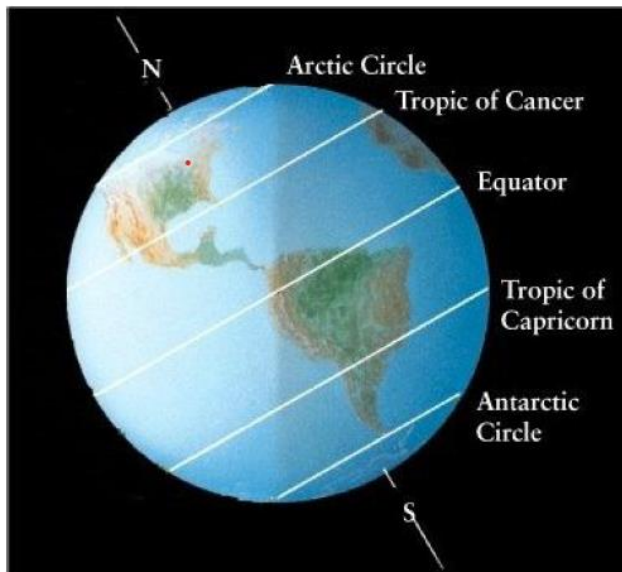
Lines of Latitude

Arctic Circle	This is an invisible line around the North Pole. Temperatures are very cold.
Tropic of Cancer	This is an invisible line between the Arctic Circle and the Equator. It can be wet with hot summers and warm winters.
Equator	This is an invisible line around the centre of the earth. Temperatures are very hot and often dry.
Tropic of Capricorn	This is an invisible line between the Equator and the Antarctic Circle. It can be wet with hot summers and warm winters.
Antarctic Circle	This is an invisible line around the South Pole. Temperatures here are very cold.

Vocabulary

Latitude	Invisible lines running around the earth parallel to the Equator.
Longitude	Invisible lines running around the earth parallel to the Prime Meridian.
Continent	A large area of land that contains different countries.
Ocean	A large body of water.
Sea	A small part of an ocean, often where an ocean and land meet.
North Pole	The most northern point on the earth.
South Pole	The most southern point on the earth.
Greenwich Meridian	The prime meridian is the imaginary line that divides Earth into two equal parts: the Eastern Hemisphere and the Western Hemisphere.
