#### History

In History we will be finding out about our earliest ancestors. We will be looking at the skills needed in order to survive and we will be finding out about prehistoric hunters. We will learn about a civilization that settled near a river and will be identifying the changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.

#### Geography

In Geography we will be using symbols and keys to represent ancient settlements and identifying local places of historical interest using a map.





#### Art

We will investigate and create our own cave paintings. We will also make and decorate pottery.

# Games/PE
