## **The Curriculum**

We place great emphasis on the core areas of the curriculum – English Reading and Writing, Mathematics and Science. English and Mathematics are taught as subjects in their own right and the skills learned are applied through cross curricular themes. Computing and Science are also taught as separate subjects. We very much believe in an inclusive curriculum that is creative, innovative and challenging, which develops the whole person taking into account individual spiritual, moral, social and cultural needs and interests. Through the curriculum we promote British Values.

Each year group studies different topics and individual subjects are woven into these to create memorable learning experiences and ensure robust academic achievement. Our curriculum is comprehensive, thematic and creative with a clear process of learning and with specific learning goals for every subject and for personal learning.



The curriculum is designed to ensure rigorous learning but also to help teachers make learning exciting, active and meaningful for the children. The pupils' learning takes a global approach helping the children to connect their learning to where they are living now, as well as looking at the learning from the perspective of other people in other countries. Our pupils are encouraged to value positive relationships and to recognise the importance of working co-operatively with others and of sharing information and resources. They are motivated by their high level of interest in knowing about the world, the assistance, praise and encouragement they receive from staff and the personal sense of pride and fulfilment that is achieved from gaining successful outcomes.

We also feel that it is important for children to develop an understanding of society and how people in it, past and present, think, feel and behave. We

address these issues through the study of History, Geography and Personal, Social and Health Education. Through Art, Design Technology, Music, Drama and Dance we seek to develop essential creative skills.

We give the children considerable opportunities to develop the skills and confidence to cope with the ever changing world of computers through the cross curricular use of Information and Communications Technology. Pupils are taught a Modern Foreign Language as part of the formal school curriculum. We also place great emphasis on the development of competitive sport in school and beyond, through PE and Games.

Our overall aim is that children discover 'how to learn' and to develop a 'can-do' attitude, have high levels of self-esteem and a thirst for learning throughout life.

At Bradwell Village School we value everyone. We therefore, ensure that we know each child as an individual and match our curriculum to his or her needs as far as is possible.

Our children are taught in a variety of ways. We use whole class teaching to introduce new ideas or to emphasise a point to be developed. We also use this style when we gather all the children for a story or talk. We use group activities to help children explore a theme in greater depth; so specific teaching can be matched to their understanding of the work. At other times the children may work individually or in pairs. We vary the organisation to provide the most effective teaching style for the situation. In all our teaching we aim to develop the children's confidence and encourage them to learn from their own experiences.

As a school, we ensure there is appropriate development and progression, and the learning is meaningful so the children are motivated and enjoy their work. We believe children should be stimulated and challenged by their work, and also gain enjoyment from it.

## **Special Educational Needs**

We are committed to giving every child the opportunity to succeed. We plan our work to enable us to address the diversity of abilities and give targeted support to children who have specific needs. The educational progress of all our children is closely monitored. We aim to identify any child's difficulties as early as possible and develop a plan to support them.

This plan is regularly reviewed. Our perceptions will always be shared with parents and carers and we will always seek their support and involvement.

## **Home Learning**

At Bradwell Village School we believe that home learning should:

- Develop an effective partnership between school and home in pursuing success for all.
- Consolidate, reinforce and extend skills and understanding in all subjects.

- Exploit resources found at home for learning, of all kinds.
- Allow children to be creative and put their own interpretation on the tasks.
- Give parents and carers an opportunity to share the experience, making suggestions and offering advice.
- Encourage pupils to develop the confidence, self-discipline and motivation needed to study on their own.
- Prepare them for the next stage of their education in secondary school.

## What is Home Learning at Bradwell Village School?

- The children have a large exercise book in which to do their home learning.
- Each week's home learning must fit onto a double page – children are allowed to stick in booklets and let their creativity run wild!
- Each week the children are given a series of tasks/activities.
- These activities are designed to consolidate, reinforce or extend the skills that have been learned in school as well as providing a useful self-assessment tool.
- The tasks are either open ended or differentiated to enable all children to access them regardless of their ability.

In addition, all children need to read regularly (at least fifteen minutes a day) and practise their multiplication tables and weekly spellings.

## Educational Visits

Visits play an essential role in our work. These vary from places in the locality for instance MK Theatre, St Lawrence Church and Bradwell Abbey to a residential trip for

## Extra Curricular Clubs

At Bradwell Village School we are able to offer a wide range of activities during lunchtimes and after school. Examples of the clubs and activities which the pupils engaged in recently include choir, football, tag rugby, athletics, basketball, dodgeball, korfbal, newspaper reporting, recorders, gardening, art and crafts, netball, rounders, tug of war, cheerleading, science, coding, drama, multi-sports and film club.





## Breakfast, After School and Holiday Club

The wrap around care is run externally by Bradwell Village Children's Club and Priory Common School. This provision enables parents and carers to access provision from 7.45am to 6.00pm during term time. There are holiday clubs also open throughout most holidays and staff training days in both locations.

## School Council

We are very proud of our School Council which makes a positive contribution to life at Bradwell Village School. It consists of two members from each class. School Council members are elected by their classmates and candidates are required to give a presentation on how they will make the school an even better place. Following discussions members put forward ideas and contribute to school planning and fundraising. School Council members are also involved in the selection of new staff.

## Eco Group

This group of children helps to keep Bradwell Village School 'green'. They meet every half term and are involved in looking after the school environment, recycling, gardening and energy saving projects.

## Brad's Buddies

Brad's Buddies are a group of children who have been trained as peer mentors to be a 'friend' to children at break and lunchtimes. They help ensure children do not feel alone, and are available to talk to if there are minor fall-outs between friends.



## Behaviour

We take great pride in the behaviour of our pupils. The emphasis in the school is to praise behaviour, attitude and effort and to increase children's awareness of the need to make a positive contribution to their community.

## Home and School

At Bradwell Village School we value and appreciate the important role parents and carers have to play in helping their child develop a positive attitude to school and learning. We offer a wide range of opportunities for parents and carers to actively participate in supporting their child in school. These include:

- Parent/Carer/Children sessions – once every term parents and carers are invited into school to work with their child during our Creative Fortnights.
- Parent/Carer/Teacher Consultations – these are opportunities for parents and carers to find out how their child is doing in school. These take place each term.
- Annual School Report and Interim Report – Parents and carers receive two reports each year and include details about your child's progress to date, together with targets for the following term.
- Year Group Newsletters – At the beginning of each term these are sent

home giving details of the topics to be taught during the term.

- School Newsletter – These are sent out each half term and include notices of forthcoming events and a summary of events which have taken place during the half term.
- Parent/Carer Coffee Morning and Curriculum Workshops – these are organised on an ad-hoc basis to raise money for charity or to provide parents and carers with information about their child's learning.
- Curriculum Booklets and Home Learning Suggestions – These are published on our website to ensure that parents are kept fully informed.

## The Governing Board

As a federated school, we have one Governing Board which covers Bradwell Village School, Priory Common and Romans Field School. Our Governing Board takes an active interest in the work of the schools and the Governors bring to their role a wide range of interests, experience and expertise. Some of their work is managed in sub committees but all Governors share responsibility, ensuring the school sets high standards. The Governing Board is made up of parents, staff, community and Local Authority Governors. Minutes of the Governing Board meetings are available from the school.

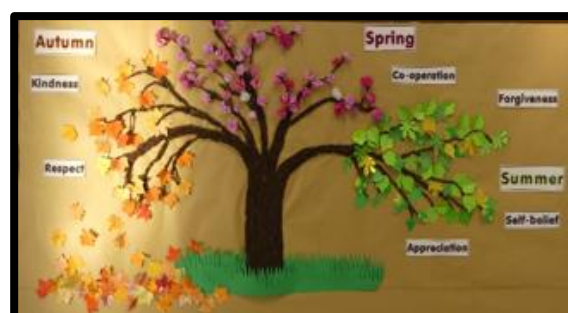
